TLC 2016 Christmas Gathering

We had a very nice little Christmas gathering and executive board meeting on December 17. Thanks so much to board member Dorothy Craig for once again opening her home to us. In attendance were special guests Janet Kruger of the Clyde Historical Society, botanist John Fody, and my father Bob Collins, in addition to TLC board members Kay Cumbow, Dan Rhein, and Cheryl Collins. Points of discussion included our North Street property, our 2017 Saint Clair County Earth Fair exhibit, and a 2017 stewardship initiative for the Port Huron State Game Area.

North Street Post Office, General Store, and Railroad Station Clyde Township, Saint Clair County

The North Street property was featured in a Times Herald article on 2017 January 02 by reporter Bob Gross. He largely followed our press release with additional quotes from our phone discussion. Unfortunately, there was no response from anyone to the article. We are still pursuing possible grant money, but it goes very slowly.

2017 Port Huron State Game Area Initiative

TLC member John Fody has been pulling invasive Garlic Mustard by himself in the Port Huron State Game Area for a number of years. We decided to make this a group effort through the TLC. We don't have many details yet, but are planning at least one Garlic Mustard pull near the end of Ford Road in late May. There are also plenty of opportunities to remove invasive shrubs like Tartarian Honeysuckle and Autumn-olive. In addition, we want to host a few nature walks to bring attention to the high quality forest community, rare plant and animal species, and impressive aquatic community of the Black River. We hope to work with other groups in the area, including the Friends of Beard's Hills and the Blue Water Audubon Society.

2017 Saint Clair County Earth Fair

The TLC will participate in the 2017 Saint Clair County Earth Fair on Friday, April 28 and Saturday, April 29, 9AM to 4PM at Goodells County Park. For more information, see the Earth Fair web site at: http://www.earthdayfair.com/

The actor would dress in period clothing, circa 1900, greet people at or near our tables, and would speak some parts from a script.
